NEW PROJECTS & COMMITTEE ANNOUNCEMENT Identity & Access Looking Towards the Future

The Identity & Access Forum has three new projects and three committee restructures to better serve our membership:

- **Project Team to Address Relying Parties** This project team will address the need and project outcome of "decks" that may be utilized at events for speaking as to what the IAF is doing and current relevant material, and keeping the material updated.
- **Project Team to Create/Develop Surveys** This project team will create and develop surveys to address feedback from members and non-members on what the current industry needs are and to support overall membership. The results will be shared so that the material shared can be disseminated through the IAF to drive membership, etc.
- **Project Team to Form Roadmap (2030)** This project team will primarily be used for strategic planning in projects and for guiding the vision and goals, along with the building blocks of progress, providing a clear picture of direction and progress.
- Communication & Education Committee Restructure This committee is restructured to include an education strategy and align with all working committees.
- The Oversight Committee for Training replacing the Identity Access Management Committee, the Oversight Committee for Training's purpose is to maintain, modernize, etc., the current and future training that the Alliance offers.
- **Digital Credentials Committee** renamed from Digital Identity Committee: This committee will concentrate and move forward with digital credentials and other digital projects outside of mDLs.

WORK IN PROCESS

Jumpstart Committee White Paper (in review) – This paper compares government and derived credentials to encourage adoption not only of mobile driver's licenses (mDLs), but of digital identity more broadly. It outlines what the future could look like for verifiers and relying parties as we transition to a landscape that includes government-issued identities and other ecosystem-driven credentials.

Jumpstart Committee ISO Working Group Report (in review) – Developed from feedback gathered at the 2025 mDL Technology Showcase in San Diego, this paper provides recommendations to ISO working groups on how they can contribute to building a stronger identity ecosystem. It reflects real-world input from relying parties and is intended to inform and guide standards efforts.



NEW PROJECT ANNOUNCEMENT

The Forum has launched a new joint project—Agentic Commerce: Security, Controls & Consumer Trust—led by the Emerging Payments and Payments Fraud Working Committees. This collaborative effort will identify key risks and opportunities introduced by agent-driven commerce and develop practical guidance to help stakeholders prepare for this next evolution in digital payments. The project will explore how wallets, financial institutions, merchants, developers, and networks can adapt to new agentic models while managing consent, minimizing fraud, and preserving consumer trust.
